

# Timeline

January-July: Take GRE

January: Application opens

May: Begin submitting applications

**Verification:** 4-6 weeks after submission After application is verified, it is released to schools. Some schools will have secondary or supplemental applications.

September 15: Application deadline

**October-March:** Schools review, select candidates to interview, and release decisions

### July/August: Veterinary school begins

• The earliest you can apply for veterinary school is the summer after junior year. Many applicants choose to take a gap year(s) and will delay applying until the summer after senior year or even the year after graduation.
