Honors College Course Substitutions

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A CURRENT STUDENT JOINS THE HONORS COLLEGE?

Students who join in their second or third year will be exempt from the Mason Core Foundation and Exploration requirements. Instead, they will take required Honors seminars.

Each student is unique and their credits are evaluated independently. However, at a minimum students take 3 HNRS seminars: HNRS 310 (formerly HNRS 302), HNRS 260, and HNRS 360.

After admission, the Honors College will evaluate transfer, AP/IB, dual enrollment, and Mason core credits to determine if they can be used as substitutes for relevant Honors College curriculum requirements.

If students have taken some Mason Core classes or have transfer credits that cover Mason Core requirements, they could potentially be used to **substitute** for **up to 4** of the 7 required Honors College seminars.
