Honors College Course Substitutions

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A CURRENT STUDENT JOINS THE HONORS COLLEGE?

Each student is unique and their credits are evaluated independently. However, at **a minimum** students take **3 HNRS seminars:** HNRS 110+111 OR HNRS 302, HNRS 260 OR 261, and HNRS 360 OR 361. Rising sophomores or juniors who join the Honors College will be exempt from the Mason Core Foundation and Exploration requirements. Instead, they will take required Honors seminars.
