





Apply for the Fee Assistance Program through  $\underline{PTCAS}$  or the  $\underline{GRE}$ 

Item	Cost
Test registration	\$205
Test prep	\$100-1,500+
Application (1 school)	\$155
Additional schools	\$60
Secondary applications	\$50-100
Interview costs	\$100-1000+
Total cost	\$1,000-10,000+

# **Experiences**

# Shadowing Experience

- Schools typically have shadowing hour requirements, anywhere from 50-200 hours completed at the time you apply
- Physical Therapy shadowing requirements by school
- Some schools will want a letter of recommendation from the PT you shadow with verifying hours or might want the PT to sign a form verifying your shadowing hours (forms found on individual school websites)

- Clinical/healthcare experience
- Community service
- Research
- Leadership and teamwork
- Extra-curricular involvement
- Strong communication skills

# A well-rounded application shows...

- Ability to communicate effectively on the application and in an interview
- Background, strengths, and what makes you unique
- Passion and fit for the dental profession
- Ability to do the academic work

# **Timeline**

January-August: Take GRE

**June:** Application opens.

**August:** Begin submitting applications

**Verification:** 4-6 weeks after submission After application is verified, it is released to schools. Some schools will have secondary or supplemental applications. <u>Application</u> <u>deadlines can vary by program.</u>

**Fall/Spring:** Schools review, select candidates to interview, and release decisions

July/August: PT school begins

The earliest you can apply for PT school is the summer after junior year. Many applicants choose to take a gap year(s) and will delay applying until the summer after senior year or even the year after graduation.

- Personal Statement (Essay)
